Painting & Lining

Please see below list of Requirements, but none of them are essential as we have had customers who have been happy to sit and watch taking in all the hints and tips for a later date.

Models to paint.	As this is a learn and have a go session, you will need a few models, they can be your best, but possibly better if they are old, from a swapmeet, or something metal you can strip and have another go at. Even Dinky cars are useful to practice on.
Paints	We have some paints for you to use or buy, but they are unlikely to be the right colour, so your colour and thinners to match. Gloss is best at this stage. Avoid acrylic paints. A 2 pack etch primer (Precision Paints) would also be useful for a brass model, but not essential as we only have the 2 days.
Air Brush	We have some airbrushes, but every model is different and it is better to practice with the one you intend to use. We have a large compressor with connectors to most airbrushes.
Paint brush	Windsor & Newton Series 7 '00' This is an exceptionally high quality brush and hence expensive. We have some stock to buy.
Face Mask	This must be suitable for 'organic solvents'. We cannot allow you to spray paint unless you have your own one, on the grounds of both Health & Safety. We have a stock of reusable ones at £19 each
Old clothes	You will be mixing paint, spraying etc
Aerosol Paint	We will start with using aerosols. A tin of Halfords grey primer would be useful, but any will do
Ruling Pen & Ruler	There is only 1 good make in the World and difficult to deal with. 'Haff'. Lining is done using a ruling pen and they are very sensitive to the tip profile and cheaper ones may or may not work. Another possible source is Antiques markets. If you are serious and intend to use the skills you will learn on this workshop then this will be needed. I will try and supply these upon the request of a number of attendees, saving on bank charges and postage from Germany.
